### HEALTH SERVICES EDUCATION GRANTS ACT FISCAL YEAR 2007 GRANT ALLOCATION

**Submitted for:** Action.

**Summary:** 

The Health Services Education Grants Act (HSEGA) authorizes the Illinois Board of Higher Education to allocate grant funds to independent Illinois institutions offering programs that educate and train health professionals. These grants assist institutions in meeting the high cost of health education programs while assuring that the State of Illinois has an adequate supply of health professionals. Eligible programs include medicine, dentistry, optometry, podiatry, pharmacy, allied health, nursing, and selected medical residency programs.

HSEGA grants are based on 1) the number of Illinois residents and Illinois minority residents enrolled in eligible programs, 2) the grant rates established by administrative rule, and 3) the level of available funding. The Board also has statutory authority to allocate a portion of appropriated funds, not to exceed 10 percent of the HSEGA appropriation, to support priority grants in an eligible program area.

In fiscal year 2007, the implementation of a 1.8 percent budget reserve reduced the amount of funding available for HSEGA grants from \$17.0 million to \$16.7 million. This amount, however, is not sufficient to fully support each institution's enrollment claim at the maximum grant rate. As a result, fiscal year 2007 HSEGA grant rates have been prorated and allocations have been adjusted.

The fiscal year 2007 recommended allocations include grant payments totaling \$16.7 million made to 57 private institutions and hospitals. This includes \$15.9 million in resident grants to all eligible institutions and an additional \$782,174 in priority grants to those institutions offering nursing programs. These allocations are based on an 84.3 percent grant rate pro-ration for all areas except nursing. Nursing grant rates are recommended at 100 percent of the maximum annual grant level as defined in the administrative rules.

**Action Requested:** 

That the Illinois Board of Higher Education approve the fiscal year 2007 allocation of \$16.7 in HSEGA grants to 57 private institutions and hospitals as detailed in this item.

### STATE OF ILLINOIS BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION

### HEALTH SERVICES EDUCATION GRANTS ACT FISCAL YEAR 2007 GRANT ALLOCATION

The Health Services Education Grants Act (HSEGA) authorizes the Illinois Board of Higher Education to allocate grant funds to non-profit, independent Illinois colleges, universities and hospitals offering accredited programs that educate and train health professionals. Health education grants assist independent Illinois institutions in meeting the high cost of health education programs while assuring that the State of Illinois has an adequate supply of health professionals. Health education programs eligible for HSEGA support include medicine, dentistry, optometry, podiatry, pharmacy, allied health, nursing, and medical residency programs in family practice and obstetrics/gynecology. These grants are based the following formula components: 1) the number of Illinois residents and Illinois minority residents enrolled in eligible health education programs, 2) the grant rates established by administrative rule, and 3) the level of funding provided.

In 2003, the Board's Committee to Review Health Professions Education Programs conducted a review of health education programs and made recommendations aimed at improving the accountability of the HSEGA program. The Committee laid the groundwork for a number of program improvements, as well as legislation that passed in 2005 which provides the Board with greater authority and flexibility in targeting resources toward high priority health professions areas. Public Act 94-193, effective July 12, 2005, amended the Health Services Education Grants Act (HSEGA) to allow the Board to "dedicate a portion of appropriated funds, not to exceed 10 percent of appropriations, to support program priority grants." The legislation also stipulated that eligible institutions that received a grant in fiscal year 2005 shall - subject to funding availability and continued accreditation - continue to receive grant support at a comparable level in subsequent years. On December 6, 2005, the Board adopted emergency rules and proposed rules amendments to reflect and implement these statutory changes. On March 14, 2006, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) ruled "no objection" to these HSEGA rules.

This item describes the formula components and processes used to determine the fiscal year 2007 recommended HSEGA grant allocations.

### **Enrollment**

The main formula component used to determine the HSEGA institutional grant award is Illinois resident and Illinois minority resident student enrollment. As part of the annual application process, institutions submit enrollment information in HSEGA-eligible programs. Institutions are also required to submit certified external audits performed at the institutional level that verify enrollment claims made by the institution in the previous year. When an institutional audit identifies an institutional error in enrollments claimed, the institution either refunds the overpayment amount or an audit adjustment is made and the institution's subsequent grant award is reduced. As seen in Table 1, the total number of Illinois residents enrolled in HSEGA-eligible

programs has increased steadily over the past four years. During the past year, enrollment increased 6.3 percent, from 7,012 in fiscal year 2006 to 7,453 in fiscal year 2007. This overall increase is due primarily to a 12.6 percent increase in nursing enrollment.

#### **Funding**

Another formula component used to determine HSEGA grant allocations is the program funding level. In fiscal year 2007, the HSEGA appropriation totals \$17.0 million, but a 1.8 percent, or \$306,000, budget reserve reduced the amount available for grant awards to \$16,694,000. While enrollment in HSEGA-eligible programs has increased significantly over the past few years, the level of funding available for awards has remained relatively unchanged. As seen in Table 2, the level of available funding for HSEGA since fiscal year 2003 has ranged from \$16.1 million to \$17.0 million. In 4 of the past 5 years, the funds appropriated for HSEGA have been reduced by a reserve. The amount of funding needed to fully fund the HSEGA program, based on eligible enrollment and the grant rates established by administrative rule, totals approximately \$18.8 million.

#### **Priority Area**

The HSEGA allocations detailed in this item reflect the recommendation that nursing, the designated priority for fiscal year 2006, once again be named as the priority health profession area for fiscal year 2007. The nursing profession has been recognized by many as the most critical shortage health profession area in the state and across the nation. Studies conducted by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) concluded that nursing shortages exist in all 10 economic development regions of the state. In fiscal year 2007, the IBHE implemented two new Nursing programs that provided fellowships to nursing faculty and grants to nursing schools for expansion and improvement. At the national level, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services projects the nursing shortage will become a more critical area of concern since the demand for nursing services is expected to continue to outpace the supply of nurses through the year 2020. The aging of the nursing workforce, the decrease in the number of nursing graduates, and the aging of the U.S. population are all factors that contribute to this shortage.

As noted previously, HSEGA statutory language now allows the Board to allocate a portion of funding, "not to exceed 10 percent of the appropriation," to support program priority grants. In fiscal year 2006, priority grants totaled \$506,673 and accounted for 3.0 percent of the appropriation. In FY2007, approximately 4.6 percent of the appropriation, or \$782,174, is recommended for priority grants. This amount of funding is needed to increase the prorated nursing grant rates to 100 percent. It should be noted that 27 of the 57 HSEGA-eligible institutions operate nursing programs and are eligible to receive nursing priority grants.

#### **Grant Rates**

The final component in determining the institutional grant award is the program grant rate. The grant rates used to determine grant awards vary by program and by degree level and are detailed in administrative rules Section 1020.4 (a) 1 and 2. When funding for the HSEGA program is insufficient to fully support the maximum grant rates, the grant rates are prorated. In fiscal year 2005, HSEGA grant rates were prorated by a factor of 93.8 percent. In fiscal year 2006, grant rates were prorated at 88.6 percent in all areas except nursing, where grant rates were paid at 100 percent. As seen in Table 3, the HSEGA grant rates recommended for fiscal year 2007 are prorated at 84.3 percent in all areas except nursing, the designated priority area, where rates are recommended at 100 percent.

### **FY2007 Grant Allocation**

As seen in Table 4, the recommended total HSEGA grant allocation in fiscal year 2007 is approximately \$16.7 million. This includes \$15.9 million in resident grants based on eligible enrollments, and an additional \$782,174 for priority grants awarded to institutions with eligible enrollments in nursing programs. The amount of funding dedicated toward priority grants represents 4.6 percent of the fiscal year 2007 appropriation.

The fiscal year 2007 recommended HSEGA allocation provides \$16.7 million to 57 Illinois institutions, including non-profit, independent colleges, universities and hospital schools. Appendix A provides institutional detail regarding the recommended allocations for fiscal year 2007 by health profession program. Appendix B provides information on the recommended allocations by institution in descending order of the total HSEGA grant recommended. As noted above, grant recipients are required to provide an audit of the previous year's grants to verify the accuracy of the reported program enrollment and paid grant amount. In some cases, grant allocations for fiscal year 2007 have been reduced as a result of an overpayment made in fiscal year 2006 as identified by the institutional audit.

The staff recommends the adoption of the following resolution:

The Illinois Board of Higher Education hereby approves the allocation of \$16.7 million for Health Services Education Grants Act (HSEGA) resident grants and priority grants, and applicable grant rates, for fiscal year 2007 as detailed in this item. Payment of grants is subject to the receipt of all required documents, and the Board authorizes the Executive Director to withhold payment or adjust a grant allocation, if necessary, to conform with existing statute and rules.
