



ILLINOIS PROUD: COMPLETING COLLEGE


Illinois is **best in the nation** in completion rates for adult learners at public universities and **ranked second** only to Washington, D.C., among not-for-profit private institutions.

The week of March 18 – 24 is designated as <u>Dual Credit Week in Illinois</u>, by <u>SR 1411</u>, sponsored by <u>Senator Chuck Weaver</u> and <u>Senator Jennifer Bertino-Tarrant</u>. In a <u>statement</u> released by <u>Illinois</u> <u>Community College Board</u> (ICCB) Executive Director <u>Dr. Karen Hunter Anderson</u> noted, "The community college system has long been a leader in the development and expansion of dual credit programs. The steady rise in dual credit enrollment reflects an understanding among secondary and postsecondary educators that early college experience is an integral part of preparing students for college and career success." <u>Dual Credit Fact Sheet</u> describes a total of 10,740 dual credit courses being offered by all 48 community colleges in the 2015-16 academic year. The <u>Illinois Board of Higher Education</u> (IBHE) approves <u>public universities and private four-year colleges</u> also offering dual credit courses. Both <u>ICCB</u> and <u>IBHE</u> administer dual credit programs in accordance with the 2010 state law, the <u>Dual Credit Quality Act</u>.

The **Northeastern Illinois University** Board of Trustees has named **Dr. Gloria J. Gibson** the new president of the University. Gibson has been serving as Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs at Morgan State University.

"I am truly honored to be named President at Northeastern Illinois University, a place I have developed a strong and heartfelt appreciation for since setting foot on campus," said Gibson, who will take the helm at Northeastern, starting June 1. "Among the things I found most impressive about Northeastern are its resiliency during the past 150 years and its diverse community. I am so honored to be a part of Northeastern's history and to be following the footsteps of strong leaders who preceded me."

Gibson will be the 10th president of NEIU and has been appointed to a three-year term. She succeeds **Dr. Sharon Hahs**, who served as University President from 2007 to 2016, and **Dr. Richard Helldobler**, who served as Interim President for the past 18 months.

Dr. David J. Livingston, President of **Lewis University**, announced **Dr. Christopher Sindt**, Saint Mary's College of California Vice Provost for Academic Affairs, will become the Provost of Lewis University, effective July 1.

"All of us at Lewis University look forward to the talent and skill Christopher will bring to our community as our provost," Livingston said. "His academic leadership and administrative experience will be helpful as our university implements a new strategic plan, reorganizes academic colleges, hires new deans and prepares for a Higher Learning Commission reaccreditation visit."

Sindt stated, "I've admired Lewis for many years for its commitment to liberal learning paired with professional education, and I am delighted to be joining the Lewis community."



After nearly four decades of leadership in key University roles, **Dr. Stephany Schlachter**, announced plans to retire as provost of Lewis University, effective June 30, 2018. She will continue to serve the University as special assistant to the president until June 30, 2019.

The Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC) has been named the 2018 "Most Effective IT Team" by **CompTIA AITP Chicago**. The award recognizes high performing Chicagoland IT teams that have demonstrated an



outstanding job in improving the success of their organization's business. The annual award was presented to the team on Thursday, March 8.

ISAC received the Most Effective IT Team award in 2015 as well, becoming the first state agency to take the honor.

"We couldn't be more proud of our CIO, Ramnath Cidambi, and the entire team," said Eric Zarnikow, executive director of ISAC. "Whether they are providing innovative technology that helps us better administer our programs or assisting other state agencies with their technology needs, we are pleased to be recognized as a leader in the field."
